she goes out and forages. She will not come back to the beach if she sees people around her pup. If you see a pup that you think is in distress, stay 100 yards away (federal law) and call or text Victoria at 360 739 6713 or Kelsey McLane at 360 927 1348. We

have a few trained responders on the island who are NOAA certified to respond. We will organize a response. We also respond to any deceased marine mammal, collect data and put it in a National NOAA database.

Due to unexpected circumstances a service was not held for Robert's passing, so if anyone has any memories or pictures that they would like to



Gear for Crabbing Up Workshop Saturday, June 25 from 2 to 4 PM at Otto Preserve Resource Center. Gear Up for Crabbing will offer participants the opportunity to learn helpful tips about when and where to set pots, how to check and modify your own crab gear to reduce the chances of your gear becoming lost, and how to increase your chances of keeping your pots and catching your limit. Gather up your crab pots and come participate! Materials will be make simple available to modifications to your own gear that will help keep your pot in place and allow crabs to escape quicker if the pot is lost and reduce the number of crabs killed by derelict gear. Bring your pots and get ready to Gear Up for Crabbing! The WSDA will again be monitoring for Asian giant hornets this summer, but they have determined Lummi Island is no longer an area of concern. Therefore, LIHT will not be running Asian giant hornet trap monitoring this summer.

After successfully eradicating several nest sites located near Blaine, scientists are focusing their monitoring efforts close to the Canadian border. According to the latest Hornet Herald, over 700 traps are being prepared for northern Whatcom County. From the notes of Lloyd L. Davis

<u>ca 600 BC</u> First evidence of the development of the Marpole culture in the San Juan Islands. The Marpole culture was a land-based hunting people with little evidence of a marine economy. Their artifacts were characterized by rude chipped stone points and implements with some use of deer antlers but few bone points. This culture named after the Marpole site on the Fraser River flourished through all the islands until ca 400 AD

<u>ca 400 AD</u> The Marpole culture had died out and the beginning of the Salishean culture is found. It was primarily a marine-based culture with a fine development of fishing artifacts using bone points, and bone and antler tools – practically identical to the recent Salishean culture.
