**1. Updated schedule for presentations and town meeting.**

## 2. **Committee members report on actions since last meeting.**

### **LIFAC presentation debrief**

Chris has gotten good feedback

LIFD commissioners need to understand difference between **EMERGENCY** access at the dock and **URGENT** access. Chris will help explain that to them. Committee to add explicit statements to presentation.

*Other feedback:* for LICA and Town Hall presentations, spell out more details for what will (will NOT) be provided at Aiston Preserve. Include a link to their site. *Other misconceptions?*

### **Survey on impact of ferry outages.**

**Mary update:** will send summary of key input and interesting statements to committee.

### **Discussion with neighbors near proposed dock site.**

Chris Immer reports that he has spoken to these 8 owners so far:

- Ed & Helen Scott support the idea of an island dock, just not at this site. However, they also pointed out that for a project with such a long timeline, their input may not be critical.
- Colleen McCrory and fellow realtors are in complete support and have no concerns.
- Dave King (next to the post office) is in complete support and expressed no concerns.
- Burnetts (Beach Store Café) very supportive.
- Wagoneer family supports the dock but asks about having a privacy fence. (First house north of the dock).
- Bringhoffs – Chris is awaiting response.
- Yeager (2 cabins south of the platform) – LI may need to put up signs if the county does not.
- Dennis Mathenson (gray house south of Beach Store Cafe) – in support.

*\*Would like to see a walkway on the east side of the road for safe pedestrian access.*

*Create a plat map with Support/Not Support to illustrate to be used by committee. Ask owners in favor to send email to the county.*

Committee envisions retaining steps to the beach – but does not have details.

### **Lane research on 2021 ferry outages.**

## 3. **Discussed the proposed site.**

Need to find out what parking situation is for existing Access Beach Park.

Have had a request from a neighbor to consider a walkway for pedestrians on the east side of the road.

Need to finalize plans at 1/23/22 committee meeting.

Committee discussed creating separate documents to share on the PDAC website. This would allow us to disseminate info from our research as follow up the Town Meeting:
